

The fun continues with John Flynn and Chris Smither and gets even better with two lovelies, Liz Longley and Kirsten Maxwell. Kirsten kicks it out of the park with her otherworldly pure vocals. If you're looking for some country gospel, it doesnt't get any better than Mark Mandeville & Raianne Richards.

As you might expect, there are a lot of impressive bluegrass musicians at **Delfest**. It always starts with Del and his offspring. What really jumps off the page (or screen, if you will) is the collaboration of Bela Fleck and Chris Thile. There isn't any genre that these two can't interpret (and haven't already played). Additionally, we're always happy to see Donna The Buffalo show up anywhere. They've been known to bend a few genres themselves.



At **Kerrville**, ground zero for the singer/songwriter set, the roster includes our favorite Canadian blues singer, Suzie Vinnick, so it looks like she's getting due props for her songwriting chops as well. Jimmy LaFave is on his farewell tour after being recently diagnosed with terminal cancer. His name appears in a bunch of festivals featured this month. "I'm on my way off the planet," he states, but "The show must go on." We hope as many as possible will go to see him before we lose his irreplaceable voice.



Our favorite lady Dobro player, Abbie Gardner, is appearing at **GottaGetGon** this year. If she lends her skills to other acts as well, it's going to be a barn burner! Bob Amos & Catamount Crossing combine virtuoso instrumentals and vocals.

We're thrilled to welcome **The Clearwater Festival** back after a one-year hiatus, and thrilled that promoter SteveLurie is back at the helm to book the best acts in roots music. It's hard to believe we'll be given the opportunity to see two of the greatest guitarists, Tommy Emmanuel and Richard Thompson on the same bill. Rachael Price of Lake Street Dive always blows our doors off. Los Lobos always gets our blood boiling. Add in Arlo Guthrie, Josh Ritter, Alejandro Escovedo and a Cry, Cry, Cry reunion and and what you've got is an embarrassment of riches. Now all we have to do is turn up at the right stages at the right times.



Old Songs Festival presents a more traditional vibe than most of what we list here. A quick listen to Atlantic Crossing revealed a band with a charming old-timey style with lots of infectious dance tracks. For social consciousness-raising and uplift, there's a collaboration between Scott Ainslie and Reggie Harris, plus Joe Jencks and Si Khan. Pat Donohue, a virtuoso fingerstyle guitarist and an excellent singer, writes and sings humorous parodies as well. He has performed on *A Prairie Home Companion* and is a national fingerpicking guitar champion.

It's difficult not to overenthuse about the talent at the Caramoor American Roots Music Festival each year. A nighttime headline co-bill of roots music stars Rhiannon Giddens and Sarah Jarosz is the icing on the cake for a daytime program that includes the Mike + Ruthy Band. I was unfamiliar with River Whyless before writing this. After watching them and listening to their ethereal harmonies plus their inventive playing and writing, this one-day festival jumped from a "maybe" to a "definitely!"

If there's any question that the **Great Blue Heron Music Festival** is the soul of diversity, look no further than the Big Mean Sound Machine to dispel that idea. With a brass section, electronic keyboards and hypnotic rhythms, the band brings some gorgeous Afro-funk to the table. Fela Kuti would appreciate the way these guys carry on his legacy. Acts such as Jim Lauderdale, Tiger Maple String Band and The Sim Redmond Band swing the vibe back in the direction of U.S. roots.



At **Winnipeg**, Brandi Carlile and Bruce Cockburn provide the star power and Begonia brings the monster vocals. For those who need their guitar fix, there's Winnipeg artist Joey Landreth (of The Bros. Landreth), apparently no relation to Sonny, although his slide guitar technique and last name might suggest otherwise. If anyone in attendance hasn't heard Northern Irish singer/songwriter Foy Vance, he's definitely going to make some new friends. Whether he wraps his vocal chords around an original song or a cover, he's going to leave an indelible imprint on the listener.

We see some familiar faces at **Mariposa** this year. Irish Mythen knocked us out at NERFA last year and the year before. Blues goddess Suzie Vinnick graced our cover in April 2013, while Madison Violet did the same in March 2011. Scenic Route to Alaska is a fun indie rock band that plays catchy pop songs.

New Bedford Folk Festival seems to be hosting an Acoustic Live Feature Alumni Party. We profiled Aoife O'Donovan when she was with Crooked Still. Other artists appearing here who've been Acoustic Live cover features include Catie Curtis, David Francey, Ellis Paul, Seth Glier, Susan Werner, The Kennedys and Vance Gilbert. I almost overlooked the folks in Session Americana (Vol. 18, Issue 9, February 2017). We saw them live, but without Laura Cortese. Those attending this New Bedford event would be wise not to miss this act.



As to be expected, the **Woody Guthrie Folk Festival** hosts singer/songwriters who know how to carry a message. It's practically a Who's Who of Songwriters R Us. Sam Baker might be Exhibit A. We also like Rod Picott and Ellis Paul. David Amram was a contemporary of Woody's (we might also want to mention Jack Kerouac). Malcolm Holcombe gets to the nitty-gritty of human existence as well as Woody ever did.



We're familiar with a number of acts at **Grey Fox**, having gone to Grey Fox when it was still at the Rothvoss Farm in Ancramdale. We've seen, among others, the host band Dry Branch Fire Squad and, of course, The Del McCoury Band. Of the bands we've just discovered, we especially like Jordan Tice & Horse County.

It's interesting to see that some old favorites like Jesse Colin Young, Dave Mason and Poco are performing at **Great South Bay**. Among the acts new to us, Spafford really stood out. A four-piece funk-rock band, their melodic guitar riffs on extended jams reminded us of *Allman Brothers Live at the Fillmore East*.

We see that Lake Street Dive is dropping by for **The Green River Festival**, so we know this new-to-us event has been carefully planned. The beloved Darlingside looks to be conquering the world, one festival at a time. Harmony-wise, we believe River Whyless is going to be taking similar steps. Rachael Price (Lake Street Dive) returns to her jazz roots, performing the American songbook in a duo with the single-named gentleman, Vilray.

The crowd at **Floydfest** should ripple in revelry when Michael Franti & Spearhead play their Caribbean-laced pop. If they don't do the same for St. Paul and The Broken Bones, it'll be because they're too busy watching lead singer Paul Janeway's onstage contortions. A quick check of Baskery got the pulse racing. Three attractive women playing roots rock? Not especially innovative, but ... when they mix in a punk edge and they're from Sweden and they're really good — it might be time to re-think this. They employ killer harmonies, the drummer doubles on banjo ... well, maybe it's time to make a trip to Virginia. Whew!

The anticipation seems to begin earlier each year. One must really try to contain the desire to wish the entire summer away in an effort to get to one weekend. It becomes a real effort to curb that desire, especially during the winter months. When the forecast calls for more snow or just more cold; it is easy to wrangle up warm memories of Falcon Ridge Folk Festival in Hillsdale, NY. The Falcon Ridge Folk Festival, an annual summer festival, brings musicians, volunteers and fans from near and far for a weekend of music, food and peace.

The drive from my home is about two hours and winds through some small towns, small cities and some small rural state routes. It is a



pretty drive and just lengthy enough to have one of those conversations that start and stop. The familiar ones that are not necessarily topic specific; they just sort of start and stop at irregular intervals. Sometimes the chat stops for a spell to enjoy the view, the music in the car or chew on a thought while sipping a hot coffee. Winding through the various towns and a periodic citing of a "Folk Festival" sign is encouragement that you are on the right path. I describe the route as "just as soon as you think you have gone too far in the wrong direction,

you realize that you have not gone quite far enough. You round a bend and get your first sighting of a tent or a flag marking a campsite. Now you know that you have *not* gone far enough and begin to feel like you are coming home after being away for a year."

On the coldest of days, or unwelcome snow or just having a bad day, I can think to an annual weekend in August in the foothills of the Berkshire Mountains, more or less where Connecticut, Massachusetts and New York greet one another and I instantly get to a better place.



The Directors' Team

For the uninitiated, if one starts with the festival's simple masthead that reads: "A three-day community of folk music and dance at the foot of the Berkshires," you will begin to get the idea. Anne Saunders, the Artistic Director, quickly added, "... accessible to all. It is part of our initiative to be inclusive in every way we can, including going beyond what the Americans with Disabilities Act requires for events to be accessible." This is a simple summation of a year of very hard work. Anne Saunders'

official title is Artistic & Publicity Director, Falcon Ridge Folk Festival, but is fondly and respectfully known as the "Queen of Folk." Her attentive hand is involved in all aspects of the festival planning. The

logistics are monumental and all seem to the attendees as seamless. This is the mark of a true professional. Her winter months are spent crafting the music portion of the festival. Each year a very careful review of the comments and suggestions are taken into account. Again, an attention to detail, that for me, makes each year better than the previous one.

Howard "Bub" Randall is the actual Festival Director and founded it in 1988. Mostly retired now, he was a building contractor for almost 50 years. He is the behind-the-scenes infrastructure man and built most of the festival



structures himself. He oversees the storage and refurbishing of every piece of equipment each year. Among a myriad of other duties, he takes care of all the necessary permits from the town, county and state and handles the giant flyer mailing.

He and Anne are the only directors and they do a superlative job!

Dancing with the Slambovians

Paraphrasing from the website, falconridgefolk. com, there are four stages each serving very specific duties for the festival. The dance tent is booked first. With two left feet and virtually no hope of ever finding rhythm and timing I tend not to spend too much time at this stage. For many people, their entire weekend is spent dancing. I will confess to always staking out a piece of dance floor terra firma to watch the Slambovians on Friday night. Joziah Longo says, "It is real magical, man. When the band gets going and everybody is dancing, the tent just seems to float away".



The Mainstage Closer

The main stage is the next stage to be worked on and will host many of the weekend's activities such as "Most Wanted Song," "Grassy Hill Emerging Artists," and on the closing night, The Legends Stage. In a brief interview with this year's closing act, Eric Andersen and Band, Eric said, "I am looking forward to playing Falcon Ridge this summer as part of my North American tour. It is such a beautiful location and has a reputation for great audiences. Needless to say I am honored to be playing the same stage with so many great artists and particularly to be the closing act and have my name included in the recent list that includes Tom Paxton, Judy Collins, and Tom Rush in recent years on the Legends Stage - not to mention it will be my first time there —ever!" Eric will be accompanied by some very familiar names, great musicians in their own right, and perennial favorites of the fans of Falcon Ridge Folk Festival. This year his band will be Cheryl Prashker on djembe and percussion, Eric Lee on violin, and Steve Addabbo on guitar. Eric also said that there is a possibility that his wife, Inge Andersen will accompany with harmony vocals.

Other Stages

The Family and Workshop stages feature different combinations of performers that are also booked on other stages. These scheduling combinations, would be a nightmare for anyone, and legitimately mindboggling for everyone else ... everyone else but Anne Saunders. As Artistic Director, she makes all programming decisions with audience surveys as an aid. Her attendance at regional music conferences, other venue recommendations, radio and internet are all sources considered in finding new performers for the audience.





The Utility Player

I wanted to get the perspective of an artist that I have seen at the festival many times over the years that I have attended. I have seen Eric Lee every year at Falcon Ridge. He seems tireless. He is either performing, going to a stage for a time slot, or chatting with an eager fan or upcoming musician. In every scenario, it's always the same windswept hair on top of a million dollar smile. In what will be his 10th year at Falcon Ridge he said, "I pretty much grew up there."

Eric plays a very important role in the festival as part of the Falcon Ridge House Band. The FRHB is often called upon to back up an artist, fill in a time slot or just about everything in between. Its members will be found throughout the weekend playing together or independently as they are needed. "Being in the house band has enabled me to play with musicians that, before, I had only watched. It has given me an incredible insight to their music."

When asked how he got his start at Falcon Ridge and if he had any help in doing so, he immediately said, "The Kennedys. They were great, so supportive and encouraging and invited me to play on stage with them." He said that the musicians at the festival are inviting of others and not competitive in an unfavorable way. "When I started playing as a kid, I would go to bluegrass jams, taking my turn on solo breaks or filling in when I could. The musicians were always helpful and encouraging. I have tried to pass this on. I ran my own weekly bluegrass jam for about two years and purposely found a place that could host all ages. We were able to invite some of the younger players to sit in with us."

His warmth and sincerity are typical of the people that I look forward to interacting with each year. From the person helping the cars get situated, to the person organizing the ticketing area, to the person watching the various entry / exit points and all the musicians and attendees in between, it is just perfect. They say that you don't get to pick family ... well ... except for those that go to Falcon Ridge Folk Festival. So in short, hope to see you back home in August some time between the 4th and the 6th, Dodds Farm, Hillsdale, NY. You can stop by the WPKN tent right near the Workshop Stage, look for me, and just say "Howdy."
